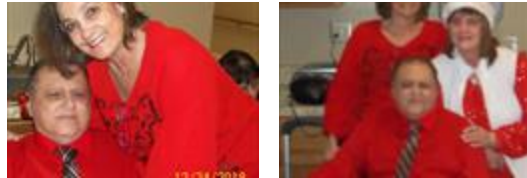
Castillo will be laid to rest at Lake Lawn Park in New Orleans, LA.

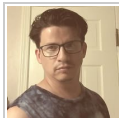
